

Young children learn gender norms at an early age and tend to bring them into their school environment. Play activities end up reinforcing that. When children play by themselves, they tend to choose activities that are stereotypically aligned with their gender. And when they play with other children, gender also affects how they play. Research also states that while boys and girls naturally play together as toddlers, by the time they reach kindergarten they are spending very little of their playtime with children of the opposite sex. At Vivero & Serra, we therefore recognize and accommodate this development by planning intentional gender

neutral activities.

Our facilitators design engagements that are inclusive. Both, the boys and girls are introduced to the same learning engagements. They are given the choice to explore possibilities. This exposure helps the child understand and respect various roles in the society. They inherit the ability to stay away from stereotyping and are open to renewed perspectives on gender roles. Such a mindset contributes to the building of responsible global citizens, those who strive to explore gender identity through introspection of various viewpoints.

play are some examples tailored to the resources at our disposal. A few activities to encourage the children to do chores around the house regardless of their gender are also organized. They are sensitized that washing, drying of clothes, cooking, washing the dishes and going to office, playing different sports has no gender barrier. They are able to understand that there are no clear lines drawn for behaviour and appearance of either of them, thus growing in respect and appreciation of their peers.

Safety Measures

First Aid Training

Handling children is a delicate exercise, and more so, when emergencies arise. It is therefore mandatory for our staff to be aware of and be trained in dealing with a variety of emergencies. It is mandatory for all our staff members at Serra International and Vivero International to undergo the First Aid training course which equips them to effectively manage common medical emergencies involving young children. Recognizing any untoward symptoms or issues is the first step, and knowing how to deal with them calmly and knowledgeably is key to effective management of emergencies. We partner with reputed Health care practitioners to train our teachers and care-givers.

Ms. Rakhi Singh, Vice President-Operations conducted a session on guiding teachers for personality development, qualities and importance of being an affectionate and empathetic human being. Teachers were also oriented through a typical day at childcare and nuances of simultaneously engaging

children with varied age groups.

A session by Aleme Avni, an experienced Counsellor was also arranged. She addressed the challenges of labeling children and their implications, effective diffusers and shared a number of case studies followed by an Open Forum for discussion and queries.

Teachers also got an opportunity to share their experiences and were taken on a tour to visit the childcare section at the host school.







Keep in Touch

Parent Teacher Meeting

Participating in a parent teacher meeting is a great way to help your child succeed at school. Whether the child is just starting school or heading to kindergarten next year, parents and teachers share important developmental information in face-to face interactions. Children do better in preschool when parents are involved in their academic development as well

These brief one-on-one meetings with the child's

teacher set the stage for a child's growth over the year. The teachers share glimpses of upcoming events and celebrations at school, and unique learning experiences that reflect unique growth journey of children. The teachers also share the Portfolios created for each child.

This Portfolio is a purposeful collection of the child's work that aims to document the story of the child's learning process. Teachers and parents can use these

moments to solidify their partnership and develop a common goal that focuses on helping the child have the best school experience possible.

A prepared parent who maintains a positive attitude and an open mind is on the right track for creating a successful, relationship with his child's teacher and school. Parent-teacher meetings are great opportunities to build a partnership with the teachers -- one that lasts for the duration of the school year.







Get ready for a parent-teacher meeting by making a list of the questions you want to ask. Some frequently asked questions could be-

How is my child doing socially and emotionally?

"How the child functions socially in the class" is a topic that should be addressed at the meeting, so enquire about your child's peer relations. It's also important to ask about your child's emotional health at school.

What do you think my child is particularly good at?

Find out about the good stuff. Ask about personal strengths that will extend beyond school.

Does my child need extra help in any areas?

Your child's teacher can tell you if your child is falling behind in a skill or domain. Armed with that information, you can create a plan with your child and his/ her teacher to work harder in that area.

May I share a concern?

If you're worried about a situation at school, bring it up with the teacher. Teachers usually appreciate when parents bring an issue to their attention, as long as it's done with respect.

Can you share some information about your teaching method?

Ask your child's teacher for more information about the teaching method, how it can help your child and what the teacher can and will do if the method does not work with your child.

Do you have any advice?

If you need help with an issue your child is having, ask the teacher for input. Seasoned teachers have worked with hundreds of students, and many have good advice to share.

Stay in touch with your child's teachers. This will not only help you strengthen your understanding of how the curriculum works and how your child is performing, but will also contribute to the success of your child, who understands and appreciates that parents and teachers are working together, and that his/her education is a top priority at school and at home.
