"The potential for growth across industries in India is inextricably connected to the development of human capital. The critical question remains whether we are developing the requisite mindsets, knowledge and skills fast enough to keep pace with evolving industries in India," said Founder and Director, Edvance Schools, Anshul Arora speaking at the panel.
