Mentor Corner

Expressions - Unit of Inquiry







Through the process of inquiry, children at Vivero construct much of their understanding of the natural and human-designed worlds. Inquiry implies a "need or want to know" inkling. They are encouraged not to seek the right answer (because often there is none), but rather seek appropriate resolutions to questions and issues. Our teachers nurture inquiring attitudes or habits of mind that will enable learners to continue the quest for knowledge throughout life.

At Vivero children carry on this process of inquiry from the time they step into school until the time they say 'goodbye' to their peers and teachers. Their process of inquiry begins with gathering information; applying that knowledge and making connections with the learnings in their day to day lives

How We Express Ourselves is an inquiry into the ways in which we discover and express ideas, feelings, nature, beliefs and values. Expression is the way in which we reflect on things, extend and enjoy our creativity or simply show our appreciation of the aesthetic.

Children of K2 at Vivero International schools across the country recently inquired into the central idea of 'expressions' through the theme of "Everyone has a Story to Tell." This became an interactive brainstorming and mind-mapping session revolving around the important elements of characters in a story, setting, plot, ending. Building on the children's background knowledge about stories, narrative and expression, as well as previous experience working with a wide range of art materials, it was proposed that they use a design process to gain a better understanding of the central idea. They researched different fictional and non-fictional stories from around the world for inspiration. The children then created and narrated their own stories from their day to day lives. As a learning community, there was abundant thoughtful discussions and reflections among the learners and facilitators. Throughout this process, children identified with their favourite characters with a range of storytelling experiences.

They eloquently and passionately 'expressed' each characters' strengths, traits and dispositions through a spontaneous dramatic play presentation. There was also a more open-minded perception about which stories were more interesting for a few of them and why? Children worked collaboratively to build their understandings in various ways, which further helped them express themselves through many new exciting experiences and interactions with each other throughout the unit.

Planning the Unit

What sets us apart as an early learning centre at Vivero Pre Schools and Childcare is an unmistakable blend of human commitment, provision of state-of-the-art facilities and our unique and ever-evolving curriculum. We take tremendous pride and dedicate hours of sincere effort while planning each unit that constitutes our academic session. The unit meeting is held during the term break after every unit where all Facilitators get together as a single unit in the city to ensure a seamless and meticulous plan is in place.

Each teacher shares her list of engagements as per a particular domain and this is discussed in detail to assess and understand the outcomes and learning goals. Teaching aids, art materials, books and other resources that are linked to the unit are deliberated upon and the requirements for all engagements spanning the duration of a complete unit are noted in advance. Plentiful research and in-depth planning of tech initiatives, ateliers, excursions, incursions is done in anticipation of the unit-culmination along with the unit-takeaway. The meeting gives us an opportunity to share, enhance and enrich the classroom learning at every level as well as ensure that best-practices receive their due recognition and execution. Only with proactive thinking and collaborating can we ensure a smooth transition into the new unit.







Jolly Phonics

Every year Vivero organizes a Jolly Phonics workshop for all teachers in order to coach refresh and further strengthen their understanding of the subject. The sessions majorly cover the broad difference between Literacy and Language and then moves on to illustrate appropriate methods in which sounds and letters can be introduced to young children for their better understanding.

These workshops also explain what is the Jolly phonics approach and effective way to introduce phonics to children as they relate better to the sounds of alphabet/words. The idea 'Jolly Phonics' believes in 'learning by doing and not learning by knowing.'

Jolly Phonics teaches educators to break down the method into simple steps such as;

- Letter sounds
- Letter formation
- Blending and Identifying sounds in words and
- Tricky words

The session is almost always very interactive and a productive one. This year, the workshop at Vivero Powai, was conducted by Ms.Bajpreet, a professionally acclaimed trainer in Jolly Phonics belonging to the education fraternity for the past 18 years.
